As a Healthy School Network member, has your school:

Created a Healthy School Team?

Using a team approach to select, plan and carry out strategies to improve school health is critical to achieving success. The assessment and planning will be more meaningful, more widely accepted, and much easier to implement if the team consists of a selection of key stakeholders. Healthy school teams should ideally include a school administrator, teacher, parent, student (strongly recommended at the secondary level) as well as health promotion and community resources partners.

Conducted the "Creating Healthy Futures: BC Healthy Schools Network Assessment"?

A key HSN requirement is to conduct the Healthy Schools Network Assessment of your school. Please establish your first year results, and then track your progress over years two and three to document changes and successes you have had through your focus on healthy living outcomes at your school. Reviewed the Healthy Schools Network Timeline?

The HSN Timeline is a quick reference for both new and continuing members to maintain positive momentum on your action research.

If you haven't already done so, January is the month to:

- ✓ Consider what evidence you need to measure student learning;
- ✓ Decide how you will collect the evidence and make it meaningful;
- ✓ Link your school inquiry question to an aspect of the Healthy Living Performance Standards; and
- ✓ Attend the mid-winter HSN/NPBS meeting in your region.

• Linked your inquiry question to an aspect of the Healthy Living Performance Standards?

Once you've selected your inquiry focus, such as healthy eating, have a look at the draft Healthy Living Performance Standards for the aspect of healthy eating, at your grade levels, to see if you can link student learning and your school focus. Using performance standards as well as formative assessment strategies will help students to understand healthy choices, and to meet or exceed healthy living learning outcomes in the areas of health and career education, physical education, planning and graduation transitions, and home economics.
